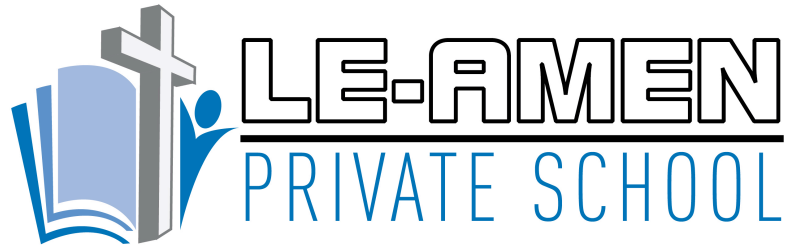

### E3

#### Grade 11/12

- Once you have successfully passed grade 10, you can apply to complete your matric through Le-Amen.
- You have to stay enrolled at Le-Amen for **two consecutive years** to be able to complete gr11/12. This applies only if you pass all your subjects every year.
- Le-Amen writes the I.E.B. National Senior Certificate Examination. It is internationally recognized.
- Due to the large amount of portfolio work for each subject, **NO subject changes** will be allowed once students have officially registered for Grade 11/12
- **NO LE-AMEN STUDENT is allowed to do Matric (7 subjects) in one year (1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> year)**, not even if he/she has already completed gr 11. Matric is done over a period of 2 years: 3 subjects (gr11/12) are written in your grade 11-year and the last 4 subjects (gr11/12) in your grade 12-year.
- Maths, Maths Literacy and Physical Science must be done over a period of 2 years.
- Physical Science may be taken as a subject only if you have Maths as a subject.
- **No grade 11 certificate will be issued.**
- Two separate certificates are combined at the end of your final year and you will receive an official matric certificate with exemption.
- Just ensure that your choice of subjects will allow you exemption. **Please consult a university** for the requirements to university exemption.
- Matric registration at Le-Amen close at the end of February.

#### For combining the certificates

**NB! NB! Only applies for students who does grade 12 over two sittings at Le-Amen**  
**Only applicable once you have successfully passed all 7 subjects in the 2 sittings**

- After completing your first year of studies, you get a “statement of results” letter from the IEB via mail, in January of your second year. This will include the marks for the first three subjects done in the previous year.
- In the April of your second year, you get a “subject statement” certificate from Umalusi, also including the marks of the subjects completed in your first year. This is sent to Le-Amen. Please contact us to fetch it.
- After completing your second year, you again get a statement of results letter from the IEB via mail, this time only containing the marks of the subjects you completed in your second year.
- The next step is to contact Le-Amen. We then apply for a combined statement of results, which reflects the 7 subjects successfully passed over the two years. This you use as proof of completing grade 12 until you get your final National Senior Certificate.
- During April of the year following your 2<sup>nd</sup> year, you get a second “subject statement” certificate from Umalusi, with the results of the subjects you completed in the second year. This is also sent to Le-Amen, and you can contact us to fetch it.
- You must then contact Le-Amen for an application form to apply for a National Senior Certificate, which you complete and send in to IEB. Please attached the proof of payment to IEB. After 6-8 weeks, you will be notified by IEB and you can fetch the combined, final National Senior Certificate from IEB.

### For application to university studies

- In your second year, you contact Le-Amen Education Centre, and we can supply you with marks from your previous year as well as the current year. These marks you can use to apply for tertiary studies.
- After completing the second year and while you wait for your final certificate, you use the combined statement of results in number 4 above and use it to register for your studies.

### Learners who are already in possession of a NSC with entrance to BD Studies

- Should you wish to improve your mark in a specific subject/s, please take into account that the new “subject statement” certificate **cannot be combined** with your previous certificate.

### Learners who are already in possession of a NSC with entrance to certificate/ diploma studies.

- Should you wish to improve your mark in a specific subject/s, please take into account that the new “subject statement” certificate **can be combined** with your previous certificate.
- **NB!! Only if the student/s results improved and you qualify for better than certificate/ diploma studies.**

## E4

### The Le-Amen Policy

It is important that you know who is responsible for the different aspects of this important phase and what the role and expectations of Le-Amen are:

- The final responsibility for the effective preparation for the final examinations lies with the matric learner
- Le-Amen deals directly with the learners and parents.
- Parents should provide the necessary support and encouragement
- Parents should always be informed by the learners about the progress of their children and to what extent they are meeting the requirements
- Le-Amen offers support in the form of material, marking of assignments, the June winter school and enrolments for the exam
- Le-Amen directs the process by the strict application of admission requirements like submitting good assignments, June exam and Prelim. This helps learners to work at the necessary pace so that they will be ready to write the exam in November.
- Le-Amen does not want to be involved in personal and family problems.
- Le-Amen will enquire about assignments that are late or not submitted at all and warnings will be given.
- The staff at Le-Amen will not assume the role of reprimanding learners when poor work is submitted.
- It is not Le-Amen policy to explain or give any report back on assignments.

## **E6**

### **NB! NB! Admission Requirements for the Final Examinations**

#### **ASSIGNMENTS:**

- **All assignments must be done**
- For every assignment in all the subjects you **must achieve 40%**.
- If you cannot make 40% in each assignment, it means that you are not ready for the Winter School.

#### **WINTER SCHOOL 24<sup>th</sup> June – 28<sup>th</sup> June:**

You have to comply with all the Winter School requirements. The Winter School requirements will be discussed in further detail during the Winter School and it will be in your Winter School booklet as well.

- Exams: Exams will be handed out on the first day. During the Winter School exams will be done under exam conditions. **Must pass with 40%**. No excuse, as layout was given what to learn 7 weeks before the Winter School.

Practicals: practicals Life Science.

Orals: Orals in all languages will be done.

Portfolio work: Will be finalized.

**NB!! A 40% pass rate for each section of each subject must be reached at the Winter School.**

#### **PRELIM EXAMS:**

- The prelim exam must be written at Le-Amen
- **You must pass the prelim exam (40%) in each subject in order to write the final exams.**

## E7

### Submitting Assignments

- Each subject has a cover page where the deadlines for the different assignments are given
- It is necessary to submit ALL the assignments
- Assignments should reach Le-Amen before the deadline. Some extra time will only be allowed in special cases.
- If we have not received your assignment a week after the due date, we will e-mail a warning to the e-mail address as on the Z10 form. **A penalty fine of R 200.00 will be charged for late/incomplete assignment/oral.**
- Do not wait for results to be sent back – start the next assignment as soon as you post one.
- NB! Make **copies** of the answer papers before you submit it. Do not include the assignment (questions) itself.
- We need hard copies, therefore do not e-mail the assignments.
- Results will be e-mailed as soon as we receive it from the markers to the e-mail address on your Z10 form.
- **All assignments must be received before the June Winter School. No assignments will be accepted after this date.**
- Teachers assisting Le-Amen with the marking of assignments may not be approached directly.

## E8

### Portfolios, Practicals

#### Portfolios

- Portfolios in all subjects are very important and make up 25% of the final result. **Work must be of a very high standard.**
- Work must be written neatly in your own hand
- Ask somebody to check your work before you submit it. Check the construction of sentences, spelling, etc.
- The portfolio must be your own, original work.
- Do not submit inferior work done in a rush.

#### Practical – Life Science

- You have to be properly prepared before the June Winter School. You must know all theory to be able to do the practical tests.
- Practical evaluation will take place during the June Winter School
- **Paper 3 Final Practical will be written by the middle of September at Le-Amen.**

**Students and parents may have access to their portfolio during the winter school. All queries must then be addressed and rectified. Students are welcome to redo pieces/orals to get a better mark. The cost involved will be R 200 per piece/oral. The portfolios remain the property of Le-Amen.**

**No copies of the marked portfolio pieces will be made.**

## E9

### Orals for the Languages

- There is an oral component for each of the languages
- The oral evaluation takes place before/during the June Winter School and is compulsory.
- Again the oral component counts 25% towards the final mark. It is therefore very important to achieve a good oral mark.
- Detailed information regarding the various components that should be prepared for oral evaluation will be included in the language package that the students receive at the beginning of the year. These components include a prepared speech, prepared and unprepared reading, listening comprehension, a CAT component, general conversation, topical issues and the prescribed fourth genre (section D – Literature)
- Should students have any queries regarding the oral component, they should contact Lindy-Lou van Tonder at Le-Amen.
- IEB moderation will take place at Le-Amen in November and is compulsory.
- Oral sessions for languages: please note that students should prepare ALL components of the oral evaluation before the winter school.

## E10

### June Winter School

- The winter school will take place from 24 June- 28 June 2019, from 09:00 to 16:00 every day. It can be that some of the practicals will be on the weekends.
  - **Attendance is compulsory.**
  - All the students must report **daily** at Le-Amen from 09h00-16h00
  - A learning centre where students can do their work will be open at all times.
  - No student will be allowed to leave the winter school unless all the work, tests, portfolio work, practicals and orals have been completed and signed off.
  - All work will be written/done under exam conditions
  - Please arrange your own accommodation and lunch.
  - This week is meant for intensive study.
  - You will receive a timetable indicating the schedule for the week.
  - The work done during the June Winter School is very important and **if you fail any component, a meeting will be arranged to discuss the matter.**

## E11

### Prelims

- Prelims are written in each subject during End August, beginning September.
- You will have to write the prelim exams at Le-Amen. This is non negotiable.
- There is no demarcation for the prelim; **you have to know the entire syllabus.**
- The prelim mark forms part of the portfolio
- Please make sure that you know exactly what paper 1 & 2 of each subject consists of.
- It is therefore essential that you give your very best throughout the year.
- **If you fail the record exam (40% is pass), you will be cancelled for the specific subject for the final exam.**

### Final Exam

- The final exam is written in November.
- **The final exam must be written at Le-Amen.** Do not phone the Examining Body to make other arrangements. It will not be permitted.

## E 12

### Re-mark or Re-check of exam papers

- Learners are allowed to take the June exam papers after the Winter School. No memorandums are available.
- The prelim papers are Le-Amen's property and will therefore not be allowed outside the examination hall.

#### Re-mark/Re-check:

- Application for the re-marking/re-checking of exam papers for **June and Prelim** will be considered from any candidate who wishes to apply therefore.
- See remark/recheck application form under "declarations" on the website
- The prescribed fee (R350/R180) must accompany the applications, which must reach Le-Amen on a date as advised on the result sheet.
- **Late applications will not be permitted.**
- If the candidate gains a higher mark in any subject or subjects, only the fees paid in respect of such subject/s will be refunded.
- No refunds will be made in cases where a candidate **still fails a subject after a re-mark**, even if the latter mark should be higher than the original mark.

#### Report back and comments on assignments/portfolio work, etc.

The assignments and portfolio pieces that are required are used to compile a mark and portfolio.

If you are not satisfied with the marks achieved, you are welcome to redo it at R 200 per piece.

It is not Le-amen policy to explain or give a report back on any assignments

Only certain draft pieces, for example the essays in languages will have a report back.

**E14**

**Effective Study Methods**

- It is easy to underestimate the effort involved in sitting at a desk, studying. You need both drive and energy.
- Studying effectively takes time and good time management.
- Establish a routine and keep to it – it reduces stress!
- Stay motivated by constantly remembering the rewards that will be the result of this effort
- Keep your body healthy and fit: eat a balanced diet, avoid stimulants such as coffee and stay awake tonics, get regular sleep, and exercise
- Select a nice place where you can study with an upright chair and a table which is large enough to accommodate all your books
- Keep the following close at hand: books, paper, pens, pencils, erasers, ruler, pocket calculator, etc
- Good lighting is essential but prevents a glare.
- The room should be well ventilated and at a comfortable temperature.

## E15

### Setting Goals

- Short-term goals: It may be a good idea to use the deadlines of assignments as your short-term goals. You could also divide the work with daily goals that will ensure that you complete an assignment before its due date
- Long-term goals: Develop a vision of what you want to do. Keeping your long-term goals in mind at all times will help you achieve your short-term goals

## E16

### Effective Time Management

- It is a general rule that evenly spaced, regular study is better than inconsistent, spasmodic bursts of effort. You will achieve much more in 5 hours at one hour per day than in studying for 5 hours at one time.
- It will help you to draw up an activity timetable to plan your day.
- Try and work at times which will be most effective for you: some people work best early in the morning and others later in the evening
- Our attention span is approximately 45 minutes. After that, our brain needs time to consolidate the material. Any study longer than one hour should include a short break.
- Plan activities completely free of study
- **Get a year planner** (most news agencies keep them) and plan your year ahead. **Indicate deadlines and exam dates so that you can see that you are on course.**

## E17

### How to submit effective assignments

- **Make your own notes as you study.** Note taking is an excellent way to ensure that you are actively busy with the material. Taking notes serves the following purpose:
  - They are an aid to concentration
  - They are an aid to retention of facts
  - They are an aid to revision, especially in the time before the exam when you have to study hard
- Be systematic and organized and arrange your notes in a logical order
- Pay attention while you work so that the information can be retained better. Work that you have revised a number of times will also be remembered better.
- Your short-term memory quickly forgets information and only those items that were successfully encoded will be transferred to your long-term memory
- For information to be coded successfully for long-term storage, the following is necessary:
  - It must enter the short-term memory often and be kept there long enough
- **Do not try to memorize work that you do not understand**
- You can better understand work by thinking about it, talking about it, asking questions, using it to answer questions, etc
- Construct well-organized notes
- Use mind maps
- **Presentation is very important when you submit work.** Even if the content is good, the initial impression is poor if the work is a mess.
- Present your work in an appealing, easy-to-read manner.
